We take this opportunity to thank our Principal Prof. Vidya Shivannavar for the constant support in breathing life into this magazine. We wish you a happy reading




Samskrutham

"Samyak Krutham" – Samskrutham. 'Samyak' – very good or pure form, 'Krutham' – done or made. In all, Samskrutham means done very well or made to its purest form. Samskrutham is one of the oldest and an ancient language. It is called as "Devanagari Bhashe". This is ancient language's origin place is "BharathaBhoomi" or "Bhaaratha". Samskrutham is considered as the most scientific language consisting 54 alphabets. Currently many alphabets are not in use. It is a language with beauty in style and expression and being adaptable for the modern world. It is a language where in one will read exactly as it is written and written as it is said or spoken.

Samskrutham is not just a language for communication but it is a way of life. Samskrutham is a language with ocean of literature or abundance in literature. It has many works such as kavyas, upanishads, puranas, vedas, shastras, mahakavyas, stories and so on. All the books aims and guides a person towards body and mind control, self development, self understanding, moral values for life, humanity, being good human first, skill development and so on. In simple words tells about one's 'Dharma' and 'Karma', that is, things should be done and things not done for a happy and successful life.

Samskrutham adds values and ethics in our life and helps us lead much better life. Here, we worship all the elements in and around us. We worship nature- trees, mountains, rocks and the 5 elements known as Panchabhoothas; people- mother, father, teacher and everyone we meet; animals- as we consider them as vahanas of various god and goddesses; food we eat and water we drink. Hence, we value and respect every element in and around us. This indulges gratitude in us for what we are blessed with and also spread oneness among us and all other species. For witnessing this, we have many sayings and shlokas such as:

"Anna Poorne Sada Poorne Shankara Prana Vallabhe"

Gnana Vairagya Sidhyartham Bhiksham Dehi Cha Parvathi"

"Athithi Devo Bhava", "Vasudaiva Kutumbakam", "Matru Devo Bhava", "Pitru Devo Bhava" and so on.

Along with life lessons, in Samskrutham, there were various famous scientists who were priorly known as Pandiths or Rishis who have discovered and written books that speaks about various subjects such as physics, chemistry, geography, social science, biology, astrology, medicine and so on. Various scientists with their works are, Rishi Kanada discussed about topics of water cycle, parmanu (atom), concept of relativity of motion- the 3 laws of motion, in his book Vaishakeya Sutra. Rishi Bhaskaracharya who discussed about differential calculus in his book Siddhantha

Shiromani and also the concept of universe and solar system. Rishi Madhav Kar provided detailed description of heart attack in 6 th century in his book Madhava Nidana. Rishi Sushrutha, who wrote that there are 900 ligaments in human body and concepts of bone marrow.

in his book Sushrutha Samhitha. The concept of gravity introduced by Varahamihira. Aryabhatta1 invented 0 to the world. Rishi Pingala discovered about the concept of binary system. Arthashastra a book on polices or rajaneethi written by Acharya Chanakya and so on. All our ancient pandiths or rishis have discovered many elements centuries ago and have recorded in manuscripts in Samskrutham. There are yet more works and books with immense knowledge and innovations.

In many books, of ancient times, there are many traditions or systems or procedures being followed from a very long period. These days people, without knowing the importance and scientific reasons behind these traditions, have declared these traditions as blind beliefs. Where as in real, these traditions are very much scientific. For instance, in our books, number 108 has a lot of importance. The reason this number has such importance is that, the ratio of sun's distance from earth to the earth's diameter and also the ratio of moon's distance from earth to moon's diameter, both these result to be 108. The most familiar and frequently heard mantra "AUM", is considered as very sacred for chanting. The scientific reason for this is that, "AUM" has 3 sounds which is considered as only primary sounds in the universe. All other sounds are the mixture of these 3 sounds. Hence, chanting this mantra has the capacity to touch all 72000 nadees of the human body. These are the sounds which can be made without the tongue. Similarly, chanting Vishnusahasranama, with correct pronunciation, the 72000 words or pronunciations activates the 72000 nadees of human body. Hence it usually said in the morning so that a person stays active for the whole day. Another practice, sitting on the floor while have food in Sukasana. This helps in a better and proper digestion of food and improves the efficiency of the digestive system. The bell's sound of the temples is also considered good for human body. This is because, the bells are made of various metals that includes cadmium, lead, copper, zinc, nickel, chromium and manganese. The proportion in which these metals are mixed to prepare the bells is the real science behind. Rightly proportioned bell's sound is such a distinct sound that it can create a unity among both human's both right and left brain. And also, once we ring the bell, it produces a sharp sound that it lasts for 7 seconds that is sufficient for activating the 7 chakras of human body. In our tradition, married Q couples are made to round around the fire for 7 times. This is because 7 is the only number that cannot divide 360, which is the degree for circle. This symbolizing that the couple's bond should not be broken by any means. This way, there are scientific reasons for many traditions being followed by our ancestors. People before concluding upon matters, should find the reason behind a practice being followed. All these traditions and practices are for one's personnel development and for a healthy life.

Hence, Samskrutham, not only being a language, is a treasury of culture, samskruthi, science, health and hygiene (both mental and physical health). It is a complete package for a person to lead a healthy, happy and satisfied or contended life. And also it is a beautiful and a sweet language to converse. One may feel the language to be tough. But until and unless we start learning any language, it will remain tough. But this is a language that should be learnt and used by everyone on daily basis. Samskrutham is considered as Mother of all languages.

Women Poets and Scholars in Sanskrit Literature

Sanskrit is known as the Mother of all languages. It is considered to be the origin of most of the regional Indian languages. Even foreign languages like, Greece, Latin and even English has traces of Sanskrit in it. Even though the number of people using Sanskrit or learning Sanskrit has decreased exponentially, it is still in practice in some of the remote places of India and in most of the schools and colleges, Sanskrit can be opted as a language for learning. There are a lot of scholars and writers who have contributed for the upholding and enrichment of the Sanskrit literature. Some of the notable scholars are Veda Vyasa, Adi Kavi Valmiki, Bhaasa, Vishnugupta, Shri Harsha, Bhavabhuthi and so on. We can see that there are more of men, who are contributing for Sanskrit. Apart from them there are Women writers and poets also, who have had their hand in the enhancement of the language.

Some of the notable and famous Women scholars are listed below:

BHAVAKADEVI

Bhavakadevi, also known as Bhavadevi, was a Sanskrit poetess from present-day India. Her verses are included in early medieval Sanskrit anthologies, including Vidyakara's Subhashita-ratna-kosha, Sudukti-karnamrita and Kavindravachana-samuchchaya

GANGADEVI

Gangadevi, also known as Gangambika, was a 14th-century princess and Sanskrit language poetess of the Vijayanagara Empire of India. Gangadevi chronicled the story of the victory of her husband, Kumara Kampana, over the Muslims in Madurai in the form of a Poem. The collection of poem is titled Madhura Vijayam, also known as Veerakamparaya Charitram. Even though she is believed to be a Telugu princess, her works are compiled in Sanskrit.

MARULA

Marula was a Sanskrit language poetess from India. Her verses are included in early medieval Sanskrit anthologies, including Sharngadhara's Paddhati and Jalhana's Suktimuktavali.

SHILABHATTARIKA

Shila-bhattarika lived in the 9th century. One of her poems mentions the Narmada River, which makes the present day scholars to believe she lived along the Narmada River, near the Vindhyas. The 10th century poet Rajashekhara praises Shilabhattarika as a leading figure of the Panchali literary style. A verse, attributed to Rajashekhara in Vallabhadeva's 15th century anthology Subhashitavali, states that this style maintains "a balance between words and meaning". According to Rajashekhara, the Panchali style can be traced to the works of Shilabhattarika, and possibly in some of the works of the 7th century poet Bana. Shilabhattarika has been quoted by several classical Sanskrit literary critics, and her verses appear in most major Sanskrit anthologies.

VIJJA

Vijja also known as Vidya or Vijjaka, was an 8th or 9th century Sanskrit poetess from India. She has beem addressed differently in major works of Sanskrit. Vidyakara's anthology calls her Vidya, while Shargadhara-paddhati uses the prakrit form Vijjaka. Vijja wrote poems featuring topics such as love, nature, changes of season, the sea and the female beauty. Her verses are characterized by eloquent expressions, long compounds, and rhythmic sound effects.

VIKATANITAMBA

Vikatanitamba (before the 9th century) was a Sanskrit woman poet, noted for her simple and elegant verse, frequently with erotic elements. Her verse comes to us from several anthologies-Sarngadhara Paddhati. compiled by Sarangadhara, (1363 AD) Subhashita ratna kosha, also known as Kavindravachana samuchhaya compiled by Vidyakara from 12th century, Saduktikarnamrita, Subhasitavali.

Her verses are noted for their suggestiveness, and deal often with sensuous themes from Shringara Rasa.

Even in the modern days, we come across a lot of female writers who have contributed for the Sanskrit language. There are a lot of well-known scholars who have mentioned about these Female poetess as well. 'Rajasekhara Charita" mentions poetesses Kamalila, Sunanda, Kanakavalli, Madhurangi, Lalitangi and Vimalangi (of <u>Malava</u>). Priyamvadha, wife of Raghunatha, wrote the poem 'Syamarahasya', and her earliest verses were in the praise of Krishna. Binabai and Visvasadevi are some of the other notable poetess of the time. Likewise, Sanskrit language have many such women poets and scholars who inspire other wemen to do some meaningful work in their life and contribute to the language and the society.







